WS 1 Biba Tominc and Matej Nikšič, Urban planning institute of Republic of Slovenia PHOTOSTORY OF OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

This will be a re-dress of a 2016 action when the residents of housing estates in Slovenia and abroad were invited to analyse their living environments through photography and attached subtitles. This time we will include the views of random visitors to the neighbourhood. We will walk through the estate with our mobiles or digi-photocameras (please bring yours), visit the nearby local allotment gardens to see the neighbourhood from a distance and take a lift to the top of one of the blocks of flats to observe the place from above. At the end we will submit the photos to the digital archives along with the subtitles — to add a new page to the Photostory of our neighbourhood.

WS2 <u>Tanja Simonič Korošak</u>, Studio TSK

WE DRAW! A SKETCHWALK THROUGH THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Sketchwalk is a form of experiencing the city and life in the city, which is active and meditative at the same time. We will learn how to use 'shorthand' sketchbook technique to draw objects, landscapes and people. On a walk through the neighborhood we will stop at three places and by drawing the observed scenes and events become part of these places. Thus experience becomes not only visual, but multisensoric. Followed by short demonstration of sketching we will try to capture into our sketchbooks the action in open public space and people in the urban context. We will digitalise our sketches at the end.

CO-DESIGNING LOCAL PUBLIC SPACES WITH CHILDREN - LET'S MAKE NEIGHBOURS' CORNER

Joint work connects people. In this workshop we will work together to set up two nodes of encounter at Bratovševa ploščad. This will be a small point in space where we will try to incorporate a variety of activities that can connect the inhabitants of residential area while entertaining, gardening, reading, caring for plants and animals etc. We will build the insects&birds house, add a bulletin board to one of them and knjigobežnica – a bookshelf – to the other. We will complete the new arrangements by planting honeyplants. The group of local herbalists and pupils from local primary school will join us.

WS4 <u>Alenka Fikfak</u> in Miha Konjar, Faculty of architecture of University of Ljubljana SETTING UP AN OPEN AIR MEETING ROOM

Following the invited call for ideas to the students of the Faculty of Architecture in Ljubljana to thinking of a "gathering space" at Bratovševa platform, we will set up a temporary wooden pavilion. This is a two-day workshop with students, where preparation works have started on May 24th and will be completed jointly with participants of the Human cities conference and local inhabitants. The pavilion will be inviting residents to pause in open public space and at the same time serve as an exhibition space for the students' submitted projects proposals during summer months.
